

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

O Lord and Master of my life! Take from me the spirit of laziness, despair, lust for power and idle talk!

LENTEN DAY 14

Today you're in Heaven!

At Liturgy this morning we hear a reading from the Epistle of Saint Paul to the Hebrews, chapter 1, verses 10-14 and chapter 2, verses 1-3. Since we read this lesson every year on the Second Sunday of Lent, let us look at some background about this Epistle.

Around 70 AD, Saint Paul wrote this letter to the Greek-speaking Christian converts who were under great pressure to return to their former Jewish faith. Some of these converts began to buckle under huge pressure from fellow Jews who had not become Christians. Naturally, they wanted the converts back in the synagogue, not in the house-churches where they were worshipping, and so they pointed out the splendid worship of Judaism in contrast with the simpler worship of Christians. They also used what they felt was another big selling point: Judaism's status as a legal religion, with economic and political connections. Because of this, many Jewish Christians started to look back at what they had been.

Saint Paul realized he had a huge problem on his hands, but undaunted he set out to stop the hemorrhaging. He boldly reminded those Jewish Christians that their new faith was superior to the prophets, angels, Moses and Aaron. He pointed out that Jesus Christ offers a *better* priesthood, a *better* sanctuary, a *better* sacrifice. Why? Because when we worship Christ, we enter Heaven!

Dear Friends: I hope this is a Lenten eye-opener. Here is how this applies to you. Remind yourself today on this second Sunday of Lent that your worship enters you into Heaven itself! But caution; you can't do it from home. You have to be in church. You have to be physically there in the Heavenly Liturgy and Sanctuary with Jesus Christ, the *perfect* Priest. You have to physically participate in His once-for-all *perfect* Sacrifice, that is, tasting the Heavenly Gift of His Body and Blood.

Result: At every Liturgy, you are entering Heaven!

The Father's speak.... LIKE THE SEA

"If the Word is our pilot, we enter into rest. But if pleasure takes hold of us, we face the danger of storms and are shipwrecked."

As with the faith of the disciples, we should speak frequently with our Master. For the world is like the sea to us, beloved. We sail on this sea, with our own free will acting like the wind. For we all navigate according to our will. If the Word is our pilot, we enter into rest. But if pleasure takes hold of us, we face the danger of storms and are shipwrecked. For just as the ocean has storms and waves, there are many afflictions and trials in the world. "When affliction or persecution ariseth, the unbeliever is offended," the Lord said. Because unbelievers aren't strengthened by the faith and because they favor temporal things, they can't stand up against difficulties. Like the foolish man's house built on sand, those without understanding fall under storms of temptation. The saints, however, have exercised their senses to be self-controlled. Because they are strong in faith and understand the Word, they don't faint under trials. From time to time, ever more powerful trials work against them, yet they continue to be faithful. They wake up the Lord who is with them and are delivered. Because they find relief as they ass through water and fire, they celebrate by offering up thankful prayers to God who has rescued them.


