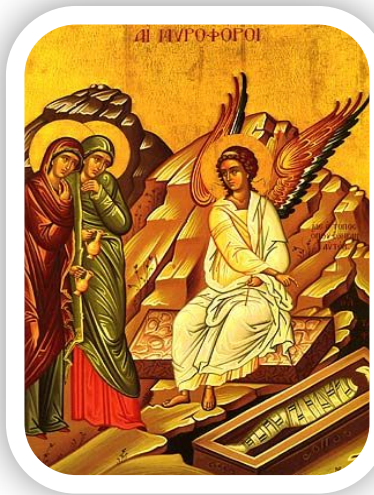

FEAST OF THE HOLY MYRRHBEARERS



The second Sunday after the Feast of the Holy Pascha is observed by the Orthodox Church as the Sunday of the Holy Myrrhbearers. The day commemorates when the women disciples of our Lord came to the tomb to anoint his body with myrrh-oils but found the tomb empty. As the woman wondered what this meant, angels appeared proclaiming that Christ had risen from the dead.

About the beginning of His thirty-second year, when the Lord Jesus was going through out Galilee, preaching and working miracles, many women who had received of His beneficence left their own homeland and from then on followed after Him.

They ministered unto Him out of their own possessions, even until His crucifixion and entombment; and afterwards, neither losing faith in Him after His death, nor fearing the wrath of the Jewish rulers, they came to His Sepulcher, bearing the myrrh-oils they had prepared to anoint His body. It is because of the myrrh-oils that these God-loving women brought to the tomb of Jesus that they are called Myrrh-bearers.

Of those whose names are known are the following: first of all, the most holy Virgin Mary, who in Matthew 27:56 and Mark 15:40 is called “the mother of James and Joseph” (these are the sons of Joseph by a previous marriage and she was therefore the step-mother); Mary Magdalene ; Mary, the wife of Clopas; Joanna, wife of Chouza, a steward of Herod Antipas; Salome the mother of the sons of Zebedee; Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus; and Susanna. As for the names of the rest of them, the evangelists have kept silence.

Together with them we celebrate also the secret disciples of the Savior, Joseph and Nicodemus. Of these, Nicodemus was probably a Jerusalemite, a prominent leader among the Jews and of the order of the Pharisees, learned in the Law and instructed in the Holy Scriptures. He had believed in Christ when, at the beginning of our Savior’s preaching of salvation, he came to Him by night. Furthermore, he brought some one hundred pounds of myrrh-oils and an aromatic mixture of aloes and spices out of reverence for the divine Teacher (John 19:39). Joseph, who was from the city of Arimathea, was a wealthy and noble man, and one of the counselors who were in Jerusalem. He went bodily unto Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus, and together with Nicodemus he gave Him burial. Since time did not permit the preparation of another tomb, he place the Lord’s body, in his own tomb which was hewn out of rock, as the Evangelist says (Matthew 27:60).

When You submitted to death, O Immortal Life, You made death powerless by the radiance of Your Divinity. When You raised the dead from the depths of the earth, all the heavenly powers exclaimed: "O Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory to You."

The noble Joseph, having taken Your most pure body down from the Cross, wrapped it in a clean shroud and anointed it with fragrant spices and laid it in a new tomb. But You, O Lord, arose on the third day, granting Your great mercy to the world.

The angel stood by the tomb and to the women bearing spices he cried aloud: "Myrrh is fitting for the dead, but Christ has shown Himself a stranger to corruption. So now cry out, "The Lord has risen, bestowing great mercy upon the world."

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

By Your Resurrection, O Christ our God, You told the women bringing ointment to rejoice; and You stilled the weeping of Eve, the first mother. You instructed the women to announce to Your Apostles: The Savior has risen from the tomb.

Now and ever and forever. Amen.

You descended into the grave, O Immortal One; yet You destroyed the power of death. As Conqueror You arose, O Christ God, saying to the myrrh-bearing women, "Rejoice!" granting peace to Your Apostles, and offering resurrection to the fallen.

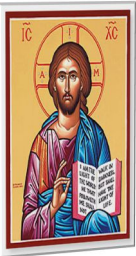

- **Confessions** are heard after Vespers on Saturday, after any weekday or Lenten service or by calling Father for an appointment.
- **Marriages** are solemnized on Saturdays. Consult Father at least six months in advance and before plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the Church.
- **Baptisms** are normally scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult Father for scheduling. Two God-parents are required, at least one of whom must be Orthodox by faith and the other a practicing Christian.
- **Church Funerals** are provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their Spiritual and Financial obligations to the parish otherwise burial is from the funeral home.
