MEMORIAL DAY

GIVE THANKS!

“We must not let any season pass without thanksgiving.”

Knowing that the Lord loves thankful people, His faithful servants never stop praising Him. They always give thanks to the Lord. Whether they are in times of ease or of suffering, they offer praise. . . Therefore, Job, who had more courage than anyone, thought of these things when he prospered. But when he suffered, he patiently endured the pain and gave thanks. David also sang praises during times of pain and sorrow. He said, “I will bless the Lord at all times.” And Paul, in all of his epistles, never stopped thanking God. In times of ease he didn’t falter, and he gloried in times of suffering. For Paul knew that “tribulation, worketh patience, and patience experience, and experience hope, and that hope maketh not ashamed.” As followers of such men, we must not let any season pass without thanksgiving. . .For the Apostle Paul, who gave thanks always urges us to draw near to God in the same way. He said, “Let your requests with thanksgiving, be made known unto God.” Desiring that we would give thanks, pray without ceasing.” For he knew that believers are strong while they give thanks. And while rejoicing, they pass over the enemy’s walls. These people are like the saints who said, “Through Thee will we pierce through our enemies, and by my God I will leap over a wall.”

Saint Athanasius

Born in Alexandria, Egypt, Saint Athanasius received a primarily Christian education. In 328, he was selected to be bishop of Alexandria, where he began a crusade against the Arian belief that the Son was a created being. Athanasius countered this heretical belief by insisting that if that was the case, Christ could not save people from their sins. His writings and teachings caused him to be exiled five times by four different rulers, but his home church accepted him with open arms each time he returned. His most important works include The Three Orations Against the Arians, On the Incarnation, and The Life of Antony which promoted monasticism for future generations.

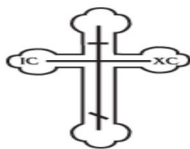

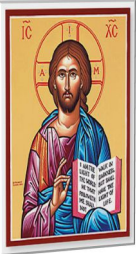
FROM FATHER'S DESK....

- **Emergency Sick Calls:** Father is available for emergencies at any time. Please call him @ 607-962-5285 or on his cell phone @ 607-377-0587.

- **Confessions** are heard after Vespers on Saturday, after any weekday or Lenten service or by calling Father for an appointment.
- **Marriages** are solemnized on Saturdays. Consult Father at least six months in advance and before plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the Church.
- **Baptisms** are normally scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult Father for scheduling. Two God-parents are required, at least one of whom must be Orthodox by faith and the other a practicing Christian.
- **Church Funerals** are provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their Spiritual and Financial obligations to the parish otherwise burial is from the funeral home.
