## RISE ABOVE

“We should be convinced that everything that happens to us is for our good.”

The Lord doesn't send suffering to the servants of God without purpose. It tests the genuineness of our love for God the Creator. Just as athletes win crowns struggling in the arena, Christians are perfected by the trial of their temptations if they patiently and gratefully accept what God sends them. Everything is ordained by the Lord's love. We must not be distressed by anything that happens to us even if it affects our present weaknesses. For although we don't know why everything that happens to us is sent by God as a blessing, we should be convinced that everything that happens to us is for our good. Every trial either provides a reward for our patience or keeps our soul from lingering too long in this life and being filled with the world's wickedness. If the Christian's hope was limited to this life, dying prematurely would be a bitter thing. But if those who love God know that the separating of the soul from these bodily restraints begins our real life, why do we grieve like those who have no hope? Be comforted, then, and don't fall under your troubles. Show that you are superior to them and can rise above them.

Saint Basil

Saint Basil (c. 330-379) was born into the family that included Gregory of Nyssa. Basil received an excellent rhetorical education and later became a powerful influence on the church in Caesarea in Cappadocia. At school, he became good friends with Gregory Nazianzen and later taught rhetoric in Athens. Influenced by his sister Macrina, he became a monk and started a monastery at his family residence. Later in life Basil became a presbyter and finally the bishop in the church of Caesarea. Despite the persecution of Emperor Valens, he remained steadfastly loyal to his Lord. His greatest works include the Hexaemeron, a series of lectures on the beginning chapters of Genesis, and a treatise entitled On the Holy Spirit.

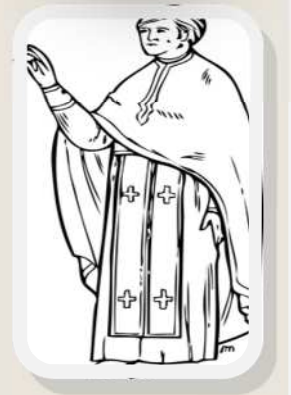

## FROM FATHER'S DESK...

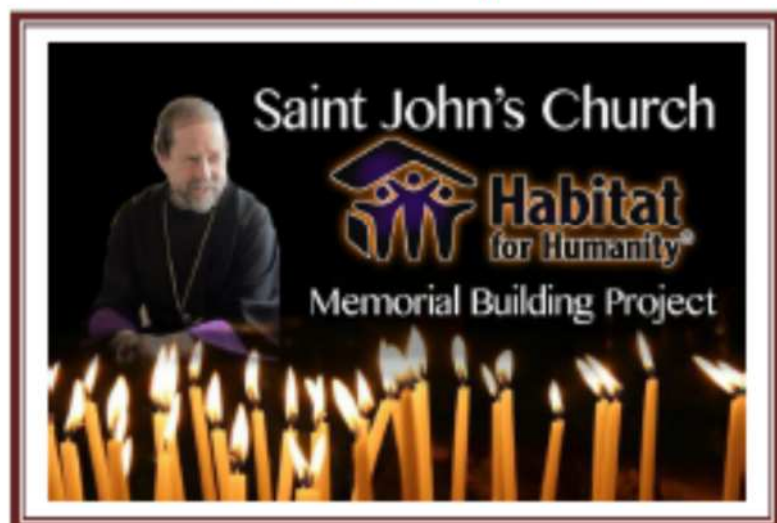
- If you would like to meet with Father, please call him @607-962-5285 to arrange a time and place which is convenient for you.

- **Confessions** are heard after Vespers on Saturday, after any weekday or Lenten service or by calling Father for an appointment.
- **Marriages** are solemnized on Saturdays. Consult Father at least six months in advance and before plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the Church.
- **Baptisms** are normally scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult Father for scheduling. Two God-parents are required, at least one of whom must be Orthodox by faith and the other a practicing Christian.
- **Church Funerals** are provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their Spiritual and Financial obligations to the parish otherwise burial is from the funeral home.
